## What is your favorite memory from your career?



## Improvement Grant will re-open in Spring 2024!

To address the declining number of licensed slots within family child care home programs and to improve quality within home-based learning environments, the <u>Buell Foundation</u>, along with the <u>Daniels Fund</u>, granted funds to the Early Childhood Council Leadership Alliance (ECCLA) to provide facility improvement funding to family child care home providers. This opportunity is intended to help family child care home providers start up, expand, or maintain consistent operations, increase capacity and reduce the number of family child care homes closing their doors due to financial restrictions.

## Early Childhood Educator Income Tax Credit

The Colorado Department of Early Childhood (CDEC) became operational as of July 1, 2022. Credentials for Early Childhood Education were previously established, issued, and managed by the Colorado Department of Education (CDE), however the management of the early childhood education credential program was transferred from CDE to CDEC on July 1, 2022 as the new department became operational. The tax credit is available beginning with tax year 2022.

Those professionals who are also Colorado Residents may now qualify for the
Early Childhood Educator Income Tax Credit.

In order to qualify for this credit, you must have:

- A federal adjusted gross income (AGI) less than or equal to \$75,000 if filing a single return or less than equal to \$150,000 if filing jointly
- Held an Early Childhood Professional Credential issued by the Colorado Department of Early Childhood for at least part of the income tax year, and
- Been either the licensee of an eligible program or employed by an eligible program for at least six months of the income tax year. "Eligible program" means either an early childhood education program as defined in section 26.5-2-202(3), C.R.S. or a licensed family child care home. "Family child care home" has the same meaning as set forth in section 26.5-5-303(7), C.R.S. An eligible program must have held at least a level one quality rating pursuant to the Colorado Shines Quality Rating and Improvement System (Coloradoshines.com/programs(opens in new window)) during the income tax year.


